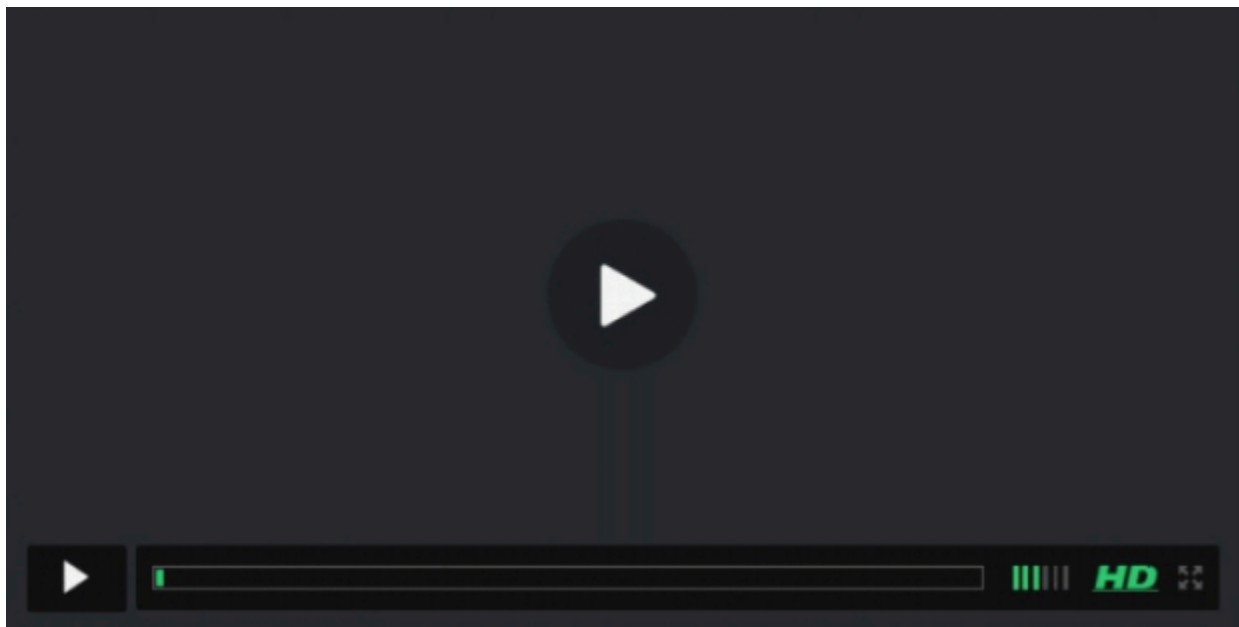


UFC 324: Justin Gaethje vs. Paddy Pimblett live stream watch party

MMA Fighting has a UFC 324 live stream watch party Saturday's UFC card at T-Mobile Arena in Las Vegas. The first event in the UFC on Paramount+ era in the U.S. is headlined by an interim lightweight title fight between Justin Gaethje and rising star Paddy Pimblett.



The wait is almost over as UFC opens 2026 on Paramount+ with a massive main event and the interim lightweight championship on the line. UFC 324 emanates from Las Vegas on Saturday night with the main card beginning at 9 p.m. ET as Justin Gaethje and Paddy Pimblett are set to collide in a main event that will surely have the sports world talking by the time it concludes.

Gaethje and Pimblett are seeking to ascend as lightweight champion Ilia Topuria steps away from the sport temporarily, necessitating an interim champion in his absence. Gaethje, a former interim champion and two-time title challenger, is arguably the most

exciting athlete UFC has ever seen. Pimblett backs up his big talk and hopes to parlay a victory at UFC 324 into an explosive grudge match with Topuria.

There's also sure to be plenty of buzz when the co-main event hits the Octagon as

former bantamweight champion Sean O'Malley takes on Song Yadong. The pair are both looking to remain relevant in a suddenly interesting title picture after Petr Yan

scored a stunning upset of Merab Dvalishvili at UFC 323. O'Malley owns a win over Yan in a non-title fight and could get himself right back in contention with a win on Saturday

after back-to-back losses to the former champ Dvalishvili. Yadong is 3-1 in his last four fights.

Plus, heavyweights are set to collide when Waldo Cortes-Acosta takes on Derrick Lewis

in the featured bout on the card. Cortes-Acosta had one of the best years of any fighter in the sport in 2025, posting a 4-1 record with three of those wins coming by knockout.

Lewis, meanwhile, remains a terrifying opponent for any rising contender. "The Black

Beast" owns the record for most knockouts in UFC history with 16 -- three more than the

next closest competitor. He's coming off a TKO of another rising contender in Tallison Teixeira last July.

UFC making its debut on Paramount+ means a whole new era is about to begin on
